

## Delineation of Procedural Privileges

### Department of Ophthalmology

Physicians applying for an appointment in the Department of Ophthalmology must be certified in the specialty.

| Category | Privileges  | Educational/Experience Requirements  |

| <b>A</b> | All activities and procedures generally performed by surgeons who are certified in Ophthalmology.   | Specialty Certification from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, or an Academic Certificate from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario. |
| <b>B</b> | Procedures requiring the use of specialized training and/or equipment as approved by the Chief of the Department including:<br><ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Retinal and vitreous surgery of the posterior segment</li> <li>2. Major orbital surgery</li> <li>3. Posterior segment laser surgery except pan retinal photocoagulation</li> <li>4. Corneal transplantation</li> </ol> | Certification and Fellowship as indicated in Category A, and additional training as defined and supported by the Chief of the Department                                 |
| <b>C</b> | Privileges granted to physicians not certified in the specialty, but who have experience, training and/or demonstrated competence.  |  |
